



### Students' Nationalities




### Students' Attendance

19 teachers (37%) possess a Master's Degree.


30 teachers (59%) possess a Bachelor's Degree.

46 teachers (90%) were formally trained in teaching.


There is a total of 8 teachers teaching English. ALL teachers have met the Language Proficiency Requirement for English. The Native English teacher is exempted from the exercise.

There is a total of 4 teachers teaching Putonghua. 3 teachers have met the Language Proficiency Requirement for Putonghua.


## Teaching Experience of Teachers




## Performance of Our Students

#### <u>Academic Achievements and Public Examination Results 2022-2023</u> HKDSE

In the HKDSE 2023, there were 72 students sitting the examination obtaining a total of 1 Level 5\*, 12 Level 5 and 33 Level 4. The best result went to So Ka Lam (S.6A) with 1 Level 5\*, 2 Level 5 and 2 Level 4.

English was the best performing DSE (Category A) core subject, obtaining 7 Level 5, 17 Level 4 and recording 84.6% passing rate which was 5.7% higher than that of whole Hong Kong school. M1 was the best performing DSE (Category A) elective subject, recording 100% passing rate which was 12.5% higher than that of whole Hong Kong school. 16 students took the examination for Applied Learning subjects with 25% attaining distinction and 93.8% "Fulfilled Attendance". For Other Languages examinations, 100% of students taking Urdu examination got distinction and Hindi recorded 100% passing rate.
