

The 6-day Cycle and Multiple Learning Period

To accommodate more subjects, the school will adopt the 6-day cycle system from this year onwards. One multiple learning period is included in the normal timetable. In this period, the class teachers can deal with class affairs. Other committees like Crosscurricular Education can also make use of this period to pass some important messages to the students. If possible,

outside speakers will be invited to give talks to the students. So far, in September and October, there have been talks on Fire Safety and Fire Drills, "Hong Kong 2003-Town Planning for Future Exhibition" by the Environmental Education Committee, the Geography Department and the Planning Department, a drama "The Most 'in' classrooms in the 21st

century" by the Hong Kong Repertory Theatre and a police talk on "Triads and Gangs". With various topics and activities, it is sure that students will enjoy learning in a more pleasurable way.

The Annual School Sports Day

The first school function of the year and the most popular among the students, the School Sports Day, was held on two sunny days, 13th September 2001 (Heats) and 17th September 2001 (Finals) at Sham Shui Po Sports Ground. The students were so excited and enthusiastic that the number of participants hit a record this year - 676! There were 52 events altogether, including both track and field events.

Displaying great athletic talent, six students earned themselves wondrous glory by winning the overall championship in their respective grades. If things go according to schedule, the MMLC is expected to be



Parents' Night for Junior Forms

To help the junior form students cope with their school life and to enable their parents to understand more about the school life of their children, the Parents' Night for Junior Forms was held on 24th October 2001, from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Around 150 parents, teachers and students were present.

The night began with the Principal's welcoming speech. In his speech, he reiterated that the parents' concerns were also the teachers' concerns as the students were just like our children. It has always been the school's policy to do the best for the benefit of the students. Following the Principal's speech, the school social worker showed a video about the kind of social services offered for young people in Hong Kong by the Social Welfare Department and other voluntary organizations. Mrs. HUI CHAN Man-yee (MSW, Ohio State University), a very senior and experienced social worker, was invited to organize a workshop for the parents. The theme was "Building a harmonious parent-child relationship on mutual respect by establishing the roles and responsibilities of parent and child". The parents showed great interest in the workshop and they participated enthusiastically in the roleplays.

After the talk, the parents had a chance to meet the class teachers of their children, discussing with them some of their child ren's problems. The night ended at around 9:00 p.m. It was a great success.
